

QGUIDED INQUIRY Step 2: What Matters to You?


Create a list of ideas, topics, or concepts that interest you

Step 3: Research, Research, Research

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Step 4: Experiment & Document

What media and materials techniques do you want to explore?

How can you take risks to stretch skills and demonstrate growth?

Do you want to combine techniques, use unconventional media, materials or techniques? Develop a plan to document all of your experiments both successes and failures

GUIDED INQUIRY Step 5: Develop a Personal Essential Question



Your essential question should be open ended without one correct answer, allow for additional questions as you make discoveries and be able to be revisited over and over.

GUIDED INQUIRY Step 6: Plan & Create

Develop a plan for what you will create based on your personal essential question: thumbnails, maquette...

Create your piece based on your research, experimentation and personal essential question

- How will you communicate your idea and plans for your piece to others?
- How will your research and experimentation be reflected in your plan?
- Do you need to create a timeline or list of tasks?
- What do you need to be successful?


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What was successful? What needs to be improved?
